Basic Financial Management (no cost) <u>workshop</u> for Small-Community Utilities

Southeast Rural Community Assistance Project Inc. (SERCAP) is a non-profit organization that assists the rural communities of the southeast US and has been in existence since the early 1970s. Our North Carolina branches has been active now for more than 5 years and has been providing this workshop now for more than 3 years and have touched more than 60-80 communities in rural NC.
